This is long overdue, and we're very excited that in the spring of 2023, our congregation overwhelmingly voted in favor of proceeding.

Yarrow Alliance Church – Executive Summary

Yarrow Alliance Church has a deep and rich history in the small town of Yarrow. Built in 1959 as a church plant by Chilliwack Alliance Church, it has been a much-loved church home to many families over the years. The main sanctuary facility has remained structurally unchanged since construction, save for a few renovations and redecorations. It has become very evident that the lack of a welcoming and gathering space is a real hinderance to ministry.

We have recently completed a storm water management upgrade to the existing building and completed the redecorating of the basement after experiencing repeated floods. This will extend the useful life of the building and prepare us for the next steps in creating facilities that would serve this, and future generations.

The proposed project is primarily a multi-purpose / foyer space along with some renovations and upgrades to the existing sanctuary building. The building proposed will provide for those with mobility challenges, including access to washroom facilities.

The new building will be a single-story wood frame structure built on a concrete foundation. This simple construction method was chosen to be predictable and keep costs in line. There will be a crawlspace under the floor for ease of servicing, while keeping the critical areas of the building well above the flood plain. The roof will be a combination of flat and peak areas, using pre-engineered wood trusses. A 2-hour fire-rated concrete block firewall will separate the new structure from the existing sanctuary building.

Exterior finishes for both the existing and the new will be painted Hardi-board siding. This will involve installing new insulation in the existing walls and replacing the windows and doors. A covered patio facing Yarrow Central Road will be a very inviting space for the church and the community. Site upgrades will include landscaping, driveway access, and parking, as well as upgrades to the main electrical service.

We have engaged Titan Construction as our Project Manager; they have considerable experience in building churches, and we've hired an architectural firm to design and oversee the project. Preliminary plans have been completed, and we have now entered the working drawing phase. This is anticipated to take 3 to 4 months to complete, followed by 3 to 4 months to obtain a building permit. This should allow us to begin construction sometime in April 2024, and we expect construction to take 8 to 10 months to complete.
